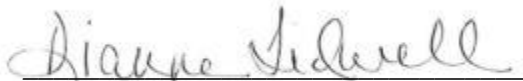

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LIBERTY, TEXAS ANNEXING A 0.27 SQUARE MILES TRACT OF LAND, PROVIDING FOR THE EXTENSION OF CERTAIN BOUNDARY LIMITS OF THE CITY TO INCLUDE CERTAIN TERRITORY IDENTIFIED BY LIBERTY COUNTY APPRAISAL DISTRICT RECORDS AS PROPERTY ID **#19341**; PROVIDING THAT ANNEXED TERRITORY BEARS PRO RATA PART OF TAXES; ADOPTING A SERVICE PLAN FOR THE ANNEXED PROPERTIES; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; AND DISPENSING WITH THE REQUIREMENT OF SECTION 3.10 OF THE HOME RULE CHARTER THAT ALL ORDINANCES BE READ ON TWO SEPARATE DAYS.

WHEREAS, the Texas Local Government Code Section 43.021 allows a home-rule municipality to (1) fix the boundaries of the municipality; and (2) extend the boundaries of the municipality and annex area adjacent to the municipality; and

WHEREAS, public hearings were held on March 20, 2018 and March 27, 2018 in the City Council Chambers of the City of Liberty, Texas where all interested persons were provided with an opportunity to be heard on the proposed annexation of the territory fully described in **EXHIBIT "1"** attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, the above described territory lies within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City of Liberty, Texas; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LIBERTY, TEXAS:

Section 1. That all of the recitals and preambles hereinabove stated are found to be true and correct and are incorporated herein and made a part of this ordinance.

Section 2. That the following described land and territory lying adjacent to and adjoining the City of Liberty, Texas, pursuant to Sections 43.035 and 212.171 of the Texas Local Government Code, is hereby added and annexed to the City of Liberty, Texas, and said territory hereinafter described shall hereafter be included within the boundary limits of the City of Liberty, Texas, and the present boundary limits of such

city, at the various points contiguous to the area hereinafter described, are altered and amended so as to include said area within the corporate limits of the City of Liberty, Texas, to-wit:

SEE ATTACHED EXHIBIT “2”

Section 3. That the above described territory is so annexed and shall be a part of the City of Liberty, Texas, and the property so added hereby shall bear its pro rata part of the taxes levied by the City of Liberty, Texas, and the inhabitants thereof shall be entitled to all of the rights and privileges of all the citizens and shall be bound by the acts, ordinances, resolutions, and regulations of the City of Liberty, Texas pursuant to Sections 43.035 and 212.171 of the Texas Local Government Code. The service plan attached hereto as **EXHIBIT “3”** is hereby adopted as part of the annexation of the property annexed to the City as provided for and now described in **EXHIBIT “2.”**

Section 4. Should any section or part of this ordinance be held unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, or the application thereof ineffective or inapplicable as to any territory, such unconstitutionality, illegality, invalidity, or ineffectiveness of such sections or part shall in no wise affect, impair, or invalidate the remaining portion or portions thereof, but as to such remaining portion or portions, the same shall be and remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. Should this ordinance for any reason be ineffective as to any part of the area hereby annexed to the City of Liberty, such ineffectiveness of this ordinance as to any such part or parts of any such area shall not affect the effectiveness of this ordinance as to all of the remainder of the area. If there is included within the general description of territory set out in Section 3 of this Ordinance to be annexed to the City of Liberty any lands or area which are presently part of and included within the limits of the City of Liberty, or which are presently part of and included within the limits of any other city or within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of any other city, or which are not within the City of Liberty's jurisdiction to annex, the same is hereby excluded and excepted from

the territory to be annexed as fully as if such excluded and excepted area were expressly described herein.

Section 6. That the requirement contained in Section 3.10 of the Home Rule Charter of the City of Liberty, Texas that all ordinances be read on two separate days is hereby dispensed with.

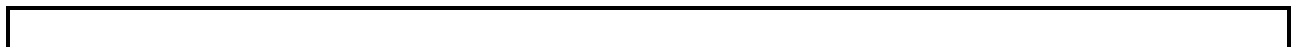

SERVICE PLAN FOR PROPERTIES ANNEXED

ANNEXATION SERVICE PLAN

The City of Liberty, Texas will provide for the extension of municipal services into the territory annexed in accordance with the following schedule:

1. POLICE PROTECTION: Provided immediately upon annexation. Service will be provided to all residents of the annexed area on the same basis as those residents currently living within the City limits.

2. FIRE PROTECTION: Provided immediately upon annexation. Service will be provided to all residents of the annexed area on the same basis as those residents currently living within the City limits.

3. WATER AND WASTE WATER: Water and wastewater services will be provided to the annexed area on the same basis as those residents currently living within the City limits.

4. EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES: Provided immediately upon annexation. Service will be provided to all residents of the annexed area on the same basis as those residents currently living within the City limits.

5. SOLID WASTE COLLECTION: Residents and business may continue to use their current solid waste provider.

6. PARKS, PLAYGROUNDS AND SWIMMING POOLS: The City parks and all recreational facilities will be available for use by residents of the annexed area, beginning on the effective date of the annexation ordinance.

7. CODE ENFORCEMENT SERVICES:

a. Enforcement of the City's ordinances will be provided within the annexed area on the effective date of the annexation ordinance. These ordinances and other regulations will be enforced using existing personnel.

b. Complaints of ordinance violations or other code violations within the annexed area will be answered and investigated by existing personnel on the effective date of the annexation ordinance.

c. Animal Control services will be provided to those areas within the annexed area on the effective date of the annexation ordinance using existing personnel and equipment.

d. Vector control services will be provided to those areas within the annexed area on the effective date of the annexation ordinance using existing personnel and equipment.

8. MISCELLANEOUS: General municipal administration and administrative services of the City shall be available to the annexed area beginning with the effective date of the annexation ordinance.

9. LIBRARY SERVICES: The City Library and facilities will be available for use by residents of the annexed area, beginning on the effective date of the annexation ordinance.

ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LIBERTY, TEXAS SUSPENDING THE RATES PROPOSED BY CENTERPOINT ENERGY RESOURCES CORP., d/b/a CENTERPOINT ENERGY ENTEX AND CENTERPOINT ENERGY TEXAS GAS ("CENTERPOINT" OR "COMPANY") COMPANY'S GAS RELIABILITY INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM ("GRIP") FILING MADE WITH THE CITY ON MARCH 29, 2018; FINDING THAT THE MEETING COMPLIES WITH THE OPEN MEETINGS ACT; MAKING OTHER FINDINGS AND PROVISIONS RELATED TO THE SUBJECT, AND DECLARING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND DISPENSING WITH THE REQUIREMENT OF SECTION 3.10 OF THE HOME RULE CHARTER THAT THIS ORDINANCE BE READ ON TWO SEPARATE DAYS.

WHEREAS, on or about March 29, 2018, CenterPoint Energy Resources Corp., d/b/a CenterPoint Energy Entex and CenterPoint Energy Texas Gas ("CenterPoint" or "Company") filed an Annual GRIP adjustment for the Beaumont/East Texas Service Area with the City of Liberty ("City") to increase gas rates in the Beaumont/East Texas Service Area pursuant to *Gas Utility Regulatory Act*, TEX. UTIL. CODE ("Gas Utility Regulatory Act") § 104.301; and

WHEREAS, the Company proposed an effective date of May 28, 2018, for the rate increase; and

WHEREAS, City has exclusive original jurisdiction over the rates, operations and services of a gas utility in areas in the municipality pursuant to Gas Utility Regulatory Act § 103.001; and

WHEREAS, Gas Utility Regulatory Act § 104.301 requires a streamlined process for the recovery of the costs of incremental investment by a gas utility; and

WHEREAS, the City's review of CenterPoint's GRIP filing is limited to a ministerial review of the filing for compliance with the statute; and

WHEREAS, the City finds the need to suspend the effective date of CenterPoint's proposed rate increase for 45 days beyond the Company's proposed effective date until July 11, 2018 in order to review the Company's filing for compliance with Gas Utility Regulatory Act § 104.301; and

WHEREAS, the reasonableness of the Company's investment will be reviewed in CenterPoint's subsequent base rate case where all costs included in CenterPoint's GRIP filing will be subject to refund.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LIBERTY, TEXAS, THAT:

Section 1. That the statement and findings set out in the preamble to this ordinance are hereby in all things approved and adopted.

Section 2. The effective date of the Company's proposed GRIP rate increase, and the proposed tariffs related thereto, are hereby suspended until July 11, 2018.

Section 3. To the extent the City finds that the rates proposed by CenterPoint's filing comply with Gas Utility Regulatory Act § 104.301, then the rates will become effective by operation of law on July 11, 2018.

Section 4. The meeting at which the ordinance was approved was in all things conducted in strict compliance with the Texas Open Meetings Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 551.

Section 5. That the requirement contained in Section 3.10 of the Home Rule Charter of the City of Liberty, Texas that all ordinances be read on two days is hereby dispensed with.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall become effective from and after its passage.

Re: **CenterPoint Energy 2018 Annual GRIP Adjustment for the Beaumont/East Texas Division**

Dear Cities:

On March 29, 2018, CenterPoint Energy Resources Corp., d/b/a CenterPoint Energy Entex and CenterPoint Energy Texas Gas (“CenterPoint” or “Company”) filed a Gas Reliability Infrastructure Program (“GRIP”) adjustment factor with each of your communities in the Beaumont/East Texas Division of the Company. The Company is authorized to make annual GRIP rate change requests pursuant to Texas law passed in 2003, Gas Utility Regulatory Act, TEX. UTIL. CODE § 104.301 (“GRIP Statute”) also see Section 7.7101 of the Railroad Commission of Texas (“Commission”) Gas Services Division Rules. The GRIP Statute authorizes gas utility companies to request annual rate increases associated with year-to-year changes in incremental investment. The changes in investment are not subject to reasonableness review in the GRIP filing. Instead all amounts collected under a GRIP filing are considered interim rates subject to review and refund in the Company’s next base rate proceeding.

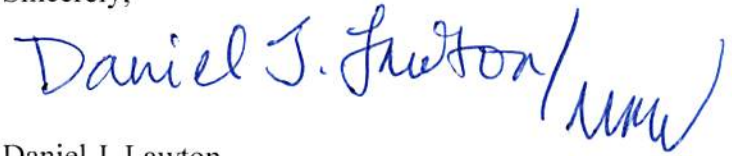
The GRIP Statute provides that the proposed GRIP rate surcharge will become effective 60 days from the date of the Company’s filing or May 28, 2018, unless suspended by the Cities. Cities may suspend the GRIP rate increase for an additional 45 days beyond the Company’s proposed effective date of May 28, 2018 while reviewing the GRIP application. Attached to this letter is a Rate Ordinance for your consideration. This Rate Ordinance will suspend the GRIP rate effective date until **July 11, 2018. Please remember if your City wishes to suspend the proposed rates you must take action by passing the attached Rate Ordinance prior to May 28, 2018.** Otherwise the Company’s requested rates will go into effect on May 28, 2018.

The review process of a GRIP filing is generally a ministerial review limited to ensuring that the GRIP filing complies with the GRIP Statute. See *Atmos Energy Corp. v. Cities of Allen*, 353 S.W. 3d 156 (Tex. 2011).

During the suspension period any issues related to whether the GRIP filing comports with the GRIP filing rules can be reviewed so that Cities may make a final decision on this GRIP proposal. **Please send a completed copy of the final Rate Ordinance to us either by mail or email.**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, ARTICLE 5, REGULATING FIRE PREVENTION AND PROTECTION; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND DISPENSING WITH THE REQUIREMENT OF SECTION 3.10 OF THE HOME RULE CHARTER THAT THIS ORDINANCE BE READ ON TWO SEPARATE DAYS.

WHEREAS, fire protection and prevention is very important to the safety and welfare of the citizens of Liberty; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Liberty, Texas, finds it to be in the public interest to regulate burning within the city limits.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LIBERTY, TEXAS:

Section 1: Article 5.01.005 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Liberty is created to read as follows:

Article 5.01.005. Burning Prohibited

- (a) Unlawful. Unless otherwise allowed by this article, it shall be unlawful for any person to burn, on public or private property, any materials, including but not limited to, leaves, limbs, trash, paper, or rubbish of any kind without the expressed written consent of the Liberty Fire Marshall.
- (b) Exceptions. Burning shall be allowed as set forth in subsections (b)(1) and (b)(2) of this section, but only when the burning does not cause an adverse impact on the community or on neighboring property owners.
 - (1) Burning may be allowed when used for recreational or warmth purposes within a self-contained fire pit or chimenea or in the preparation of food.
 - (2) On-site burning of trees, brush, and other plant growth may be allowed for land clearing operations when the materials are generated only from that property and no practical alternative exists for its removal. Prior approval for said burning must be obtained in writing from the City's Fire Marshall.
- (c) Any person violating this ordinance may be found guilty of a class C misdemeanor.

Section 2: That the requirement contained in Section 3.10 of the Home Rule Charter of the City of Liberty, Texas that all ordinances be read on two days is hereby dispensed with.

Section 3: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date that it is published in the newspaper on two separate dates.
